VIRGINIA HOSPITAL

Stay Safe in Your Home and On the Go

To promote safe aging in-place, the Virginia Hospital Center (VHC) Senior Health staff provides the Philips Lifeline medical alert service to Mount Vernon at Home members at a reduced rate. The medical alert button can be used to request help for medical concerns, not just a fall. Anyone living in northern Virginia can benefit from this service regardless of the hospital you use. Various options are available to provide service within your home or as a mobile system. **Benefits include:**

- Help at the touch of a button 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year
- · Immediate assistance to reduce chance of hospital stay
- · Installation and all service performed by local VHC staff
- Month-to-month service; no need to sign a long-term contract

Village members receive a discounted rate starting at \$32 per month for standard, in-home service with a landline. To add the AutoAlert service (fall detection), the cost is \$47 per month with a landline. (Fees are slightly higher if a home doesn't have a landline.)

For Village members interested in a mobile option, the monthly cost is \$47 per month with a one-time fee of \$99 to purchase the button. Please contact VHC Senior Health Department to inquire about the service that is right for you. Please call **703-558-6859**.
